Church News

This past week we attended the IAYM Ministry Conference in Oskaloosa. The Body of Reps accepted the Board on Coordination's recommendation and approved Manny Garcia as the new General Superintendent of the Iowa Yearly Meeting. They have already sold their house in Wichita and bought a house in Oskaloosa. Their plan is to move in on the 16th of August.

Attendance at the Conference was about half of what it was six years ago when I attended my first one. Some of that is a result of Covid, but it has been declining for quite a while. I counted eight from Bangor Liberty who came down for at least part of the conference. There was a good deal of discussion about attendance and involvement not only at the YM level but at the monthly meetings also. This was a result of the fact that we have many of the committees at the YM that are only partially filled. The committees on Church Extension, Christian Ed, and Youth and Young Adult are missing at least 3 members each. If you are paying attention we have the same issue though not on the same scale here at Bangor Liberty. different topics over the years. The social issues were at the head of this. Same sex marriage, the LGBTQ Community, our affiliation with various outside groups these were all raised in various ways. Most of the questions weren't about changing our stance but in how we present that to outsiders. How do we interact and have relationships with those who hold different views as a YM.

There have been questions raised about making changes to the Discipline over the years as well. If anything the changes being advocated deal more with making the language clearer and updating some of the reasoning for these stances. For example, the section on Quaker Peace testimony in the current Discipline is rooted in the 1970s with a focus on a person's reaction to a military draft being in place. Today the chance of a military draft is remote at best. I will also be serving as clerk for the IAYM M&C board for the next year.
